Bharat is an ancient civilization which has nourished the philosophy of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "the whole world is my family." Since thousands of years, it has exhibited the openness to assimilate newer religions and philosophies as a part of its culture.

Unfortunately, the Eurocentric control of India's history and knowledge systems has given a biased and incomplete representation of the true nature of Hindu *darshan* (philosophy). Important traditions and texts like Veda, Ramayana, Mahabharata and others were dismissed as myths or mythology by the colonial administrators. The western influence continued to be propounded in the various educational institutions even in the post-independent period.

The Government of India introduced New Education Policy (NEP) in 2019, which focuses on value added courses to correct such anomalies. Greater emphasise is laid on Bharat centric knowledge tradition. Keeping in tune with the changing times, this programme on Hindu Studies, highlights the importance of an ancient knowledge system while it gives a better understanding to the present and future generations of the importance of Bharat in the global scenario.

The importance of Hindu studies has fundamental theoretical dimensions. These dimensions enable better understanding of the Hindu *dharma*, its importance in *bharatiyasamaj* and *bharatiyasanskriti*. This programme elaborates and justifies the *dharmic* and cultural aspects of Hindus. Besidesit also presents a critical exploration of various other ideas and philosophies that are dominant in contemporary world and provide an alternative set of knowledge system to promote greater justice and 'manavta' for holistic living.

Course Objectives:

The Two years' postgraduate programme attempts to retrieve the resource pool of knowledge on Hindu *dharma* and its spiritual traditions.

The master's programme is structured to showcase the importance of Hindu Studies in a rapidly changing technological and global information society. This enables the students to understand their roots and face the challenges of modern times.

The master's programme is to acquaint students with the past and present of Hindu *darshan* (philosophy) and to study its intra-relationship with the world.

The post graduate programme in Hindu Studies is to prepare students for a range of careers in the field of Hindu Studies such as teaching and research; consultants; writers; and philosophers etc.

The basic purpose of the postgraduate program is to stimulate intellectual curiosity and research attitude in the students.

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Number of Seats: The programme would induct 60 students in one division.

Admission: Eligibility: Any graduate with a degree from Science, Technology, Social Sciences or Humanities with a minimum of 45% marks or an equivalent Grade is eligible to apply. Admission is based on Merit

Fee Structure: Form & Entrance Examination Fee: Rs 300/-First Year, Second and Third Year fee would be Rs. 14000/- each year.
