GENERAL INFORMATION

FACULTY OF SCIENCE

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has blossomed from the Baroda College, which is one of the oldest centers of learning in western India. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda is the only state university with a residential, unitary character having English as the sole medium of instruction. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has become internationally renowned over the years. Faculty of Science is a constituent institution of The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda under its direct management and control. This Faculty began as an integral part of Baroda College which was founded by His Highness Sir Sayajirao Gaekwad of Baroda in the year 1881. He also started the Sayaji Jubilee Institute in 1933 and housed all science subjects under it. The Foundation stone of the Sayaji Jubilee institute was laid in 1926 by Sir Daniel Rufus Isaacs, Viceroy and Governor General of India.

The efforts of establishing a Residential University at Baroda were initiated by Maharaja Sayajirao in 1908, but it became a reality only during the rule of His Highness Pratapsinhrao Gaekwad. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda came into existence on 30th April 1949. Through the constitution of the University, all the science departments were reconstituted as Faculty of Science. The Faculty of Science steadily made significant strides in various disciplines of science and attracted students from all over India and from other countries. It soon developed into a cosmopolitan center of education. The growth of the faculty thus amply complimented the pioneering efforts of the great visionary, Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad, who had taken great pains to improve science education.

B.SC. PROGRAMME

This is an undergraduate degree programme of four years (eight semesters) duration. The program follows Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) comprising of 176 Credits leading to B.Sc. (Honors) or B.Sc. (Honors with Research) degree. This program has multiple entry points and multiple exit points. The program also allows a student to take a break from the studies and re-enter the program so as to complete the program within 7 years from the date of admission in first year.

A student of B.Sc. Programme is required to choose one major and two minor disciplines. Apart from the courses in major and minor disciplines, students will be offered courses in various categories such as Inter-disciplinary minor, Multi-disciplinary courses (MDC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value-added courses (VAC), and Project/ Internship/ Dissertation. Major

subject is the subject in which the student will be awarded B. Sc. (Hons.)/ B. Sc. (Honors with Research) degree after successfully earning 176 Credits across the eight semesters.

<u>Certificate in Science</u>: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 44 credits will be awarded the Certificate in Science with the three disciplines chosen by the student in the first year.

Thus, for example, if a student of B.Sc. program with Botany as the Major discipline and Zoology & Chemistry as the minor disciplines opts to exit after successful completion of the first year, he/she will be awarded "Certificate in Science with Botany, Zoology and Chemistry".

<u>Diploma of Science</u>: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 88 credits will be awarded the Diploma of Science in the Major discipline.

Thus, for example, if a student of B.Sc. program with Botany as the Major discipline opts to exit after successful completion of two years, the/she will be awarded "Diploma of Science in Botany".

<u>Bachelor of Science</u>: Students who opt to exit after completion of the third year and have secured 132 credits will be awarded the Bachelor of Science in the Major discipline.

<u>Bachelor of Science (Honors)</u>: Students of 4-year B.Sc. program who successfully complete 4 years, without a rigorous research project/ dissertation will be awarded the Bachelor of Science (Honors) in the Major discipline.

<u>Bachelor of Science (Honors with Research)</u>: Students of 4-year B.Sc. program who successfully complete 4 years, with a rigorous research project/ dissertation will be awarded the Bachelor of Science (Honors with research) in the Major discipline. A student can opt for B.Sc. (Honors with Research) degree in the beginning of 4th Year. Intake capacity of B.Sc. (Honors with Research) program will be determined based on the availability of research guides in the department.

CREDIT SYSTEM

By successfully completing a course, student will earn the credits assigned to the course. A theory course requiring classroom instructions of 15 hours per week in a semester is assigned 1 credit. A laboratory course/ field work/ workshop requiring 30 hours of activities by student per week in a semester is assigned 1 credit. Internship/Project/ Dissertation are the full-time courses requiring a student to carry out 7-8 hours of activity per day.

For example, a theory course requiring classroom instructions of 45 hours per week in a semester is assigned 3 credits.

COMPUTATION OF ELIGIBILITY PERCENTAGE

Deduction for Multiple Attempts

If the number of attempts in passing the qualifying examination is greater than 1, then 2% per each additional attempt is deducted from the computed percentage of marks (% of three science subject theory). Non- appearance stages before passing the qualifying examination shall also be considered as extra attempt(s) and accordingly marks shall be deducted. The finally adjusted percentage may be called 'Eligibility Percentage'. If number of attempts is 1, the eligibility percentage is same as the computed percentage.

JAJIRAO UNIL

After passing the qualifying examination, if the candidate has a gap of more than 3 years then the candidate will be required to upload an **Undertaking Form** for the Gap period.

Addition of Marks for Sports Persons

The criteria for addition of up to 5 percentages are described in Point No. 5 (g). If any deduction or addition is required, then the student should do that to ensure her/ his eligibility accordingly and then proceed to fill application form.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

Government of Gujarat rules for the reservation of seats will be applied: SC: 7%, ST: 15%, SEBC: 27%. The remaining 51% of seats will be open for all categories. The scanned copies of all original certificates should be uploaded at the time of filling out the online application form. If any relevant certificate is not uploaded, the candidate will NOT be considered for the claimed reservation category.

A candidate, irrespective of her/his reservation category, for admission, will be <u>first considered for Open category</u> (open for all) based on merit.

- a) The **SC** and **ST** applicants of other than Gujarat state should upload a certificate from competent authority of Government of Gujarat <u>if their original certificate DO NOT indicate</u> that their caste / Tribe is recognized under such category in Gujarat also.
- b) The **SEBC category applicants** are required to produce a valid **non creamy layer certificate** from a competent authority.
- c) There will be **10** % supernumerary seats for **Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)** (additional seats over and above the total number of available seats), reserved for the candidates from Gujarat State only. Within this 10% quota, **33**% seats shall be further sub-reserved for female students belonging to the same Economically Weaker Sections. A certificate of EWS category issued by a competent authority must be uploaded to avail reservation under this category.
- d) Reservation for physically disabled students: 5% of the total seats are reserved for the persons with benchmark disability in accordance with the provisions of the section 32 of the rights of persons with Disabilities ACT, 2016. They should produce a recent/current year certificate of Civil Surgeon stating the type of disability, extent (%) of disability and state (Progressive/ non progressive) of disability. Only those students who have minimum 40% disability are eligible to be considered for the reservation. A scanned copy of this certificate must be uploaded, while filling the application form, for claiming the reservation under this category.
- e) Reservation for wards of Defence persons (Ex/In- Service): 1% of the total seats are reserved under this category. The scanned copy of a certificate issued by competent authority must be uploaded for claiming reservation under this category.
- f) **Reservation for Kashmiri Migrants**: 1% of total seats are available as supernumerary seats reserved for this category.
- g) Advantage to Sports Persons: Please note that the benefit to sports persons is granted ONLY if the candidate has participated/ received medals in State level or higher-level competitions. The scanned copy of a certificate issued by competent authority must be uploaded to avail this benefit.
 - Students who participated at State level event: 3% marks to be added in their computed percentage.
 - ii. Students who won a medal at State level or participated at National level: 5% marks to be added in their computed percentage.
 - iii. Students who won a medal at National level or participated / won a medal at International level:

 Direct admission shall be granted.

- h) Reservation for wards of the Staff of the University: 01% of total seats are available as supernumerary seats reserved for the wards of the in-service staff of The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda. This reservation is available only for the seats under regular fees category. The scanned copy of a certificate issued by competent authority must be uploaded to avail this benefit.
- i) If the seats remain vacant after stipulated admission rounds in the SC/ST reservation category s, then these seats can be interchanged among SC/ST.
- j) After granting admission to all the students of any reserved category on respective reserved seats, if the seats remain vacant then these seats shall be transferred to General category seats.
- k) Supernumerary seats which remain vacant shall NOT be transferred to any other category.
- I) All Certificates should be VALID till August 2023


ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. REGISTRATION

Homepage on https://www.msubaroda.ac.in/ of The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda provides link for Registration and Application for Admissions. The link can be visited by clicking on **Admission 2023** or **Admission Link** or **Admission here**.

A tutorial link for **Student Registration Manual** and **Frequently asked questions are alsoavailable for assistance and guidance for registration,** on the same page.

Candidates are strongly advised to carefully understand the online Registration and Application procedure by watching the training video. <u>Click here</u> for watching the video. The video can also be viewed by visiting the home page.



- The candidate is <u>first</u> required to do the <u>Registration</u> before going for Application to a particular programme.
- The candidate is required to do the <u>Registration ONLY ONCE</u> even if he/she wants to apply <u>for different Undergraduate Programmes</u> <u>offered by Faculty of Science.</u>
- The candidate is required to do <u>separate Application for different</u> <u>Undergraduate Programmes offered by Faculty of Science.</u>
- Applications for BSc at Faculty of Science Main campus and BSc at M K Amin College, Padra must be done separately.

On visiting the page https://admission.msubaroda.ac.in and then selecting Faculty of Science in the menu bar, the complete list of various Undergraduate and Postgraduate programs offered by the Faculty of Science will appear.

m) The candidate should complete the online registration and then go for the application process as explained in the training video. Once the candidate's Registration is completed and personal information verified by him/her, a Userid and Password shall be generated online and shall be sent to the registered mobile number of the candidate through sms. This Userid and Password should be kept securely, as the candidates will be able to log into their accounts through these credentials only. Before filling in the application form, student is expected to download the Prospectus and Admission Guidelines for BSC Admissions 2023 and thoroughly understand the information and admission procedure. 2. ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

Provide all the details asked in the online application form including the details of passing the qualifying examination. The student is categorized as belonging to Vadodara district or Other districts of Gujarat or Other States and Union Territories of India based on the location of the school from where the student has passed the qualifying examination or the location of exam centre in case of open school.

Scanned copies of the documents listed below must be uploaded while filling the online application form. A candidate will not be considered for a reservation category if the corresponding documents are not uploaded.

4. ADMISSION PORTAL FOR F.Y. B.SC.

After the last date of submission of online application form, the candidates will be provided login credentials, through email and sms, for the admission portal separately developed for the online admission process for admission in the First Year of B.Sc. (Honors) programme.

All the information and updates about the online admission process will be provided to the candidates through this portal only.

It is important to understand that the login credentials provided by the Admission Portal for Subject Preference Filling and Admission Rounds will be different from those provided after Registration. Candidates should keep both the login credentials secure.

5. ADMISSION ROUNDS

A schedule of admission rounds will be published on the admission portal.

Candidates will be invited to participate in the online admission rounds in the order of their merit.

The invited candidates will be required to confirm their participation through the admission portal.

Candidates not invited for participation in an admission round may be invited in a subsequent admission round if the vacant seats are available. It is, therefore, advised that the candidates visit the admission portal on the scheduled dates for admission rounds.

When a candidate decides to confirm his/her participation in an admission round, he/she will be presented a page on which the **subject group selections** are required to be done from the list given below based on his/her subject group at the qualifying examination (A or B or AB)

The participation of a candidate in an admission round shall be confirmed only after completing the subject group selection.

Subject Group Selection at Faculty of Science-Main Campus (see page no. 7)

Candidates must select as many subject groups as desired, specifying preference number for each subject group. Candidates are advised to select adequate number of subject groups (minimum five at least) to avoid non-availability of seats. Candidates will be considered for admission in the subject group in order of their preferences.

Subject Group Allocation

The University will verify the documents uploaded by candidates only for the candidates participating in an admission round. If any information is found incorrect or erroneous, the university reserves the right to either reject the application form or incorporate the corrections at its discretion. The decision of rejection/ correction shall be informed to the candidate and will be binding to the candidate.

After the verification of documents, subject groups will be allocated to the eligible candidates in order of their merit and as per their preferences. The information of the allocated subject group shall be sent to candidates through their registered email address and SMS on their registered cell phone.

6. FEES PAYMENT

Candidates can confirm their admission by **making online payment of the fees** within three days from the date of the allocation of subject groups. The online payment of fees can be made through the admission portal only.

If the fee is NOT PAID within the stipulated time, the admission of candidate will automatically get cancelled and NO EXTENSION will be granted for the payment of fees.

The fee for the first TWO Semesters of Grant in Aid BSc Program, including Examination fee is:

Girls: Rs. 7640.00* Boys: Rs. 8840.00*

The successful payment of fees will be reflected on the admission portal within 24 hours after the payment of fees. **Candidates are advised to preserve the transaction number and the fee receipt** which can be downloaded from the admission portal.

* As per the Fee Regulation Committee of the University, the fees are likely to be increased by 10%.

7. BETTERMENT OPTION

Those candidates who have confirmed their admission by payment of fees within the stipulated time will be provided an option to participate in the next round, if any, for betterment of the subject group allocated to them.

Candidate can opt for betterment through the admission portal after successful payment of fees.

It is therefore necessary to confirm the admission by paying the fees if a candidate is desirous of getting a subject group of a higher preference.

Additional subcomponents can be incorporated by the concerned department. The subcomponents and their weightage can vary from one course to another and the same will be announced in the beginning of academic year.

- 1. All mid-semester examinations will be conducted by respective departments. However, they will be centrally coordinated by the faculty examination cell.
- 2. Marks obtained in the Mid-semester examination will be carried forward in case of ATKT. The weighted sum of marks obtained in mid & end semester examinations will be considered for awarding the final grade point for the course.
 - (University reserves the right to change this distribution of weights)
- **3.** Examination papers of theory courses will contain 40% objective questions and 60% subjective/descriptive questions.

GRADE POINT SYSTEM

A system comprising of 7 grade points (4 to 10) will be followed for evaluating a candidate in every course. Both mid-semester and end-semester exams are counted for final grade points.

AWARD OF CLASS

Marks-sheets of semester I to V of B. Sc. will simply indicate the result as either Pass or Fail or ATKT but not the class which will be indicted only in the last Semester mark sheet. The class will be awarded based on the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), computed as: $CGPA = \sum (Semester credits X SGPA) / Total Semester Credits$

The sum is taken over from Sem-I to Sem-VI for B. Sc.

The award of class will be as shown in the table given below.

IMPORTANT

- > The admissions will be strictly based on the merit. Just fulfilling the eligibility criteria DOES NOT GUARANTEE admission.
- > The admission to any of the course is PURELY TEMPORARY and subjected to various scrutiny till the unique Permanent Registration Number of the candidate is generated.
- > If the information provided by the candidate is incorrect or if any unfair practice is followed or the candidate is unable to submit any of the required certificates in the stipulated time period, her/his admission is liable to cancellation.
- ➤ For subjects like Botany, Geography, Geology and Zoology FIELD VISITS are COMPULSORY. The duration in B. Sc. 1st and 2nd year is generally 1-3 days (within Gujarat) and in 3rd year/ 4th year it is generally 7 to 15 days (within India).

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THE CONDUCT OF STUDENTS IN THE UNIVERSITY

- 1. A student must do nothing either inside or outside the University that will interfere with its orderly working and discipline.
- 2. This comprehensive rule covers most cases that are likely to arise. It forbids:
 - a. Impolite or unseemly behaviour in classroom or University premises during working hours of the College and the Faculty.
 - b. Attempt to persuade other students to abstain themselves from regular classes.
 - c. Damage to or defacement of University furniture, fittings and property.
 - d. Disobedience of notifications or instructions issued by the Principals/Deans/Heads of the Departments and Members of the staff duly authorized.
- 3. As per UGC regulation, stipulated attendance (Ordinance 183) is required for permitting students to appear for final examination. If unavoidably absent on account of health, urgent private affairs or other reasons, they must be prepared to state the exact reason for absence.
- 4. Students are expected to behave with courtesy towards the members of the staff, their fellow students and all visitors to the Institution.
- Sexual harassment of any student will lead to severe punishments like suspension, rustication from the University / College/ Institution. Disciplinary action will be taken as prescribed under The M. S. University of Baroda rules.
- 6. Ragging is prohibited on MSU Campus, is a criminal offence and liable to severe punishment, including suspension, rustication and imprisonment.

Maintenance of Stipulated Attendance of Students (Ordinance 183)

The following shall be the minimum attendance necessary:

- i. In a semester an overall attendance of at least 75% of the number of lectures delivered and tutorials, seminars etc. arranged in all subjects, provided the total attendance in each of the subjects offered is at least 60%.
- ii. In a semester an overall attendance of at least 80% of the days allotted for practical classes and laboratory work in each subject.

COMPULSORY THALESSEMIA BLOOD SCREENING

It has been made COMPULSORY for each new student taking admission in the University from academic year 2017-18. Final Eligibility of any student for admission to any course to this University will be granted ONLY after she/he submits report of the Thalassemia blood screening.

Students are encouraged to get the test done either at University Health Centre,
Red Cross Society Lab or any Private Pathology Lab and <u>submit a copy of the</u>

<u>report</u> at thetime of On the Spot Admission.
