

MSU, Durham Univ strengthen ties

Vadodara: By agreeing to collaborate for semester stay abroad programmes, summer internships among a host of other facilities, MS University has strengthened its partnership with United Kingdom (UK)-based Durham University.

The two universities have also agreed for articulations in the areas of science and social sciences including education and archaeology besides collaborating for online certificate courses and continuing professional development (CPD) programmes in areas of common interest.

The MoU to this effect was signed during the recent visit of MSU vice-chancellor professor Vijay Kumar Srivastava and director of Office of International Affairs professor Dhanesh Patel to Durham, UK. "Specific

areas like high performance computing, machine learning, artificial intelligence, data science and business computing were also discussed for collaborations," said Patel.

"The collaborative opportunities include common areas of research strengths including ancient urbanism, heritage and climate change, political sociology and philosophy; electoral studies, foreign policy analysis, and public administration. We have also agreed to collaborate for joint studies through MSU's UGC Centre for Advanced Studies in Education which is an inter university centre for teaching education," said Patel.
